### A GUIDE TO YOUR CHILD'S MONITORING REPORT

- Your child will get one monitoring report every term which will allow you to track their progress in all their subjects.
- The monitoring report will tell you their percentage attendance. An acceptable attendance is seen as being over **95%**.
- The monitoring report tells you what your child's **Minimum Expected Grade** will be (**MEGs**). A **MEG** is the minimum grade we would expect your child to achieve by the end of Year 11. This would mean your child was making as much **progress** as other children in other schools.
- CPP** stands for **Current Predicted Progress**. This is the grade teachers professionally predict your child will gain **at the end of Year 11** if they carry on working in the way they are. These grades are **fine graded** (7.1, 7.2, 7.3 etc) with **7.1** being a higher grade than **7.3**.
  - The number 1 after the grade e.g. 7.1 means the grade is secure and your child could move up to the next grade with intervention;
  - The number 2 e.g. 7.2 means the grade is secure;
  - The number 3 e.g. 7.3 means the grade isn't secure and your child could be in danger of dropping down to the grade below.
- Current Grade** means the grade students are currently working at and is based on recent assessments, classwork and home learning.
- C2L** means '**commitment to learning**'. It ranged from 1-6 (1 is the highest) and is a reflection on how engaged your child is with learning. If your child receives a C2L grade of 4 or below, it will have code identifying their issue with learning. The codes are as follows:

<b>A = attendance</b>	<b>B = behaviour for learning</b>	<b>C = classwork</b>	<b>H = home learning</b>	<b>V = variable work</b>
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- Home Learning Concerns** – a '**N**' means there are no home learning concerns and a '**Y**' indicates there are home learning concerns.
- All of our grades at Key Stage 3 are in line with the new GCSE grades which are now graded from **9** (highest) to **1** (lowest). The table below shows the new 9-1 grading system and how it relates to the old GCSE grades
